A tribute to Demelza's founder president

Derek Phillips, Demelza's founder president, has sadly died, aged 83.

Along with his late wife Jennifer, Derek established the charity in memory of their daughter Demelza, who tragically died of a brain tumour aged 24. The charity has been dedicated to supporting care for local children with complex conditions ever since, helping families to make precious memories during challenging times.

Demelza's Legacy

After a mammoth four-year fundraising effort which amassed £4 million, the couple opened Demelza's first hospice in 1998 in Sittingbourne, Kent - a beautiful building with its iconic oast house which Derek, an architect, had designed himself.

Derek's wife, Jennifer, sadly died three years later. She is remembered in the Kent hospice's Garden of Tranquility, along with many of the children and young people who have benefited from Demelza's care and support.

Paying tribute to the founder, Demelza CEO Lavinia Jarrett, who joined Demelza in 1999, said, "We owe a great deal to the insight, dedication and fortitude of Derek Phillips. He had great vision and belief that the people of the South East would support the needs of a hospice for the children in our area.



Our supporters have never disappointed and have never failed to ensure Derek's vision lives on, providing specialist care and support to children and their families."

Derek, who was living in Southampton at the time of his death, stepped down as chairman of the Board of Trustees in 2001, taking on the role of Demelza's founder president.

In May 2022, Derek received a Prime Minister's daily Points of Light award, which recognises outstanding individuals who are making a change in their community and inspiring others.

Meet Demelza Music Therapist - Pete

"I came to music therapy later than some, after working for many years in advertising and project management.

I first heard of music therapy when my mum became ill and spent the final week of her life being cared for by a hospice. I was so interested that I enrolled in the training programme which included a foundation course and masters degree.

I'd always known I wanted to work with children and, after the experience with my mum, I felt connected to hospice work. As such, I requested a placement with Demelza. I was nervous as I wasn't sure if I would be emotionally robust enough. However, about three weeks in, I knew that Demelza was where I wanted to work, and I am thrilled to now be one of Demelza's Music Therapists.

I have had some deeply poignant learning experiences, including end-oflife support for families. When a family is amidst waves of medical staff, constant medications and often pain or distress, being able to provide a little oasis of musical calm, of empathy, humanness, and kindness is such a privilege.

What I really love about working here is the variety; one day you could be

supporting premature babies with a music therapy session in a local hospital, the next you're working with a child whose sibling has a complex condition, and the next you could be delivering a group session to several young adults."

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Music therapy sessions

Last year Demelza delivered 447 music therapy sessions to 159 children and their family members.

Family Story

"Henry was born on Christmas Day in 2021, when we were catapulted into a completely different world to what we had expected.

Henry spent a month in the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU), during which time doctors ran every test possible to work out what was going on with our son.

Henry was eventually diagnosed with an exceptionally rare genetic condition called CASK gene mutation, which causes seizures, global development delays and difficulties swallowing and feeding, among other challenges.

We were told there were only eight living boys with the condition and that the life

expectancy of our son would be very short.

It was soon after this that we were referred to Demelza. At the time, hospice care to us meant that our son needed end of life care. It wasn't until we visited that we learnt the range of support on offer.

Overnight respite and care at home have enabled us to enjoy some of the pleasures that we simply cannot have with a disabled child. Hiking, long cycle rides, the theatre, a meal out and going to the gym together. These are all things that have brought us joy, thanks to Demelza.

My partner Matt and I have been able to enjoy 'being us' rather than being exhausted parent carers. We spent three nights at Demelza Kent last year, where we enjoyed swimming with Henry, film nights in the cinema room, long morning bike rides and afternoon naps. It felt like a holiday.

The hydro pool is just amazing. We have spent many an afternoon watching Henry floating in the warm waters, whilst Matt and I relax in the jacuzzi. We also love the beautiful tranquil gardens there. Sitting with an early morning coffee, listening to the birds, without having to worry about whether Henry needs us, is a memory that I still think back to. The community nursing team are equally amazing. When we have care at home, we can do little things – go for a coffee together, have a lie in, or even get odd jobs done that are otherwise difficult to do. The time always flies by as Henry is making music or crafting and having a happy time."

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At the moment, Demelza is the only support that we get and they have been a lifesaver for us as a family."
